




DISSEMINATION AS AN ONGOING PROCESS TO STIMULATE CHANGE

- ! if necessary, involving new partners and building a structure
- ! making use of interim results and developing them further collaboratively
- ! dialogically transferring results in different formats

important questions in the process of dissemination

- ▶ What results should be communicated?
- ▶ Addressees : To whom should the results be communicated? Why should they know about them? What should change for whom?
- ▶ What is the best way to communicate the results?
- ▶ Who is best suited and takes responsibility for communicating the results?

▼ IMPACT AS A RESULT OF PARTICIPATORY RESEARCH (BANKS ET AL. 2017)

- 1. PARTICIPATORY IMPACT**
individual changes in the thinking & practices of those involved in the research process
- 2. COLLABORATIVE IMPACT**
changes based on (research) findings in practice, groups and organizations
- 3. COLLECTIVE IMPACT**
changes occurring in the long term on a societal/policy level
