Dear applicant,

this compilation of institutions to apply for funding is not meant to be complete. However, it provides an **overview** of institutions relevant to the **Master of Arts in Social Work as a Human Rights Profession** (MA-SWHR) and **Master of Arts in Intercultural Conflict Management** (MA-ICM). Please note that this document is updated once a year and that the information is taken from the original website sources and changes might have occurred. For this reason, it is recommended that students check the websites by themselves for the most updated information. Some of them are in German language. This does not automatically mean that only citizens from Germany may apply. In this case, we would suggest that you contact those organizations via e-mail.

Keep in mind their deadlines! Some deadlines are as early as September of the preceding year. Therefore, you should consult their websites well in advance to your application to find out if you meet the criteria.

The following text is an example that may be considered as a standard procedure with many of the foundations ("Stiftungen"). This might help you getting organized before starting your research.

Procedure for "Stiftungen":

First, write a short letter stating who you are and why you are interested in their specific aims (see their homepage to check their agenda and whether this fits your own) and why you want to study the MA-ICM or MA-SWHR. Remember to ask for their application forms and their deadlines as early as possible, even without being accepted to our graduate program. If a German embassy or a representative of the foundation you are interested in is near you, get their advice. Normally, they prefer foreign students who are already in Germany. If you apply from abroad, they will only consider your application after our official confirmation and/or offer of enrolment. You will also have to explain to them that you do not need the TestDaF/DSH German exam for studying the MA-SWHR or MA-ICM since this is an English language program.

Our students have received so far scholarships from the following foundations and institutions:

Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung, DAAD, Brot für die Welt, Rotary, Caritas etc.

Important Note:

We would like to inform all our applicants that the Alice Salomon Hochschule Berlin does not offer the "Deutschlandstipendium" to students in non-consecutive Master's programs including the MA-SWHR and MA-ICM.

Political Foundation

Bundesstiftung Rosa Luxemburg e.V. (Rosa Luxemburg Foundation)

The Rosa Luxemburg Foundation is one of the six major political foundations in the Federal Republic of Germany, tasked primarily with conducting political education both at home and abroad. The foundation is associated with Die Linke (= The Left), a democratic socialist party in the German parliament. The foundation's work has adhered to the legacy of its namesake, German socialist leader Rosa Luxemburg, and stands for democratic socialism with an unwavering internationalist focus. The foundation is committed to a radical perspective emphasizing public awareness, education, and social critique. It stands in the tradition of the workers' and women's movements, as well as anti-fascism and anti-racism.

The Scholarship Department of the Rosa-Luxemburg-Stiftung awards financial grants to highly-qualified undergraduate and doctoral students from Germany and abroad who evidence high levels of social and political engagement. In granting scholarships, the Stiftung seeks to counteract the social, political and gender discrimination prevalent in our society, and therefore gives preference to applications from women, students of non-academic and migrant backgrounds, the socially needy, and people with disabilities who demonstrate comparable achievements and commitment.

Requirements for applicants

Deadline April 1 and October 1

Language skills Those applying for the scholarship program for international students should have German competences on a level of **B2 or above**.

Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung (Friedrich Ebert Foundation)

The Friedrich Ebert Foundation supports young, ambitious talents who advocate for a just society based on social democratic values. Its scholars are part of an engaged and open-minded community. In addition to financial assistance, the foundation provides intellectual support, particularly in fostering a deeper understanding of politics and democracy. The foundation is associated with SPD (= Social Democrats).

In order to apply for a scholarship, it is essential that you live in Germany and study at a German university. The FES provides funding for all fields of study. Women, students from STEM subjects, students at universities of applied sciences, first-time graduates (= students who are the first person in their family to attend higher education) and students from immigrant families are highly

encouraged to apply.

Deadline	Programs for Germans and refugees: April 30 and October 31 Program for foreign students: May 31 and November 30
Language skills	Those applying for the scholarship programs for international students and refugees will have to prove sufficient German competences.

The Cusanuswerk offers scholarships to outstanding Catholic students beginning their first full-time degree at a University of Applied Sciences (Fachhochschule) in Germany in the upcoming winter semester. Applicants should demonstrate exceptional academic performance, interdisciplinary interests, and a commitment to social responsibility and volunteerism. Membership in the Catholic Church and a lived Christian faith are essential. Applicants who belong to a non-Uniate Orthodox or Ancient Near Eastern Church can apply on a case-by-case basis.

Ernst Ludwig Ehrlich Studienwerk (Ernst Ludwig Ehrlich Scholarship Fund)

(Scholarships for Jewish Students)

The Ernst Ludwig Ehrlich Studienwerk was founded in 2009 as an organisation to support gifted students within the Jewish community. The association exclusively and directly pursues non-profit purposes. Its purpose is the promotion of education and science. The association realises the purpose of its statutes primarily by providing material and non-material support to talented Jewish students and doctoral candidates. The ELES expects above average academic achievement, but also great dedication to extracurricular activities: in Jewish communities, youth work, social work, student organisations, and the student environment in general. They support Bachelor's studies but applicants who are applying for a Master's program are also viable. It is, however, important that the application be made at the beginning of the master's program.

Each month, scholarship recipients receive a study allowance of €300, up to €855 depending on their income, as well as supplements for health and long-term care insurance.

Evangelisches Studienwerk e.V. Villigst (The Evangelisches Studienwerk Villigst)

(Scholarships for Protestant Students)

Evangelisches Studienwerk Villigst takes on Christian responsibility for the world through providing scholarships for gifted students. It believes that talent and particular intellectual and creative skills obligates such people to use their gifts in a social, future-oriented way and in open communal approaches. It supports young people who are willing to face these challenges of the future in all fields of society in the Protestant tradition.

Evangelisches Studienwerk awards scholarships for studying at universities of applied sciences and universities all over Germany. It supports students from all disciplines and subject areas. Important criteria are their enthusiasm for their own subject, good performances and a keen interest in interdisciplinary topics. You can apply as a person with a legal refugee status provided you hold a residence permit in accordance with BAföG.

It offers its students intensive and individual support, a varied and interdisciplinary range of seminars as well as co-determination on all levels of our institution. The financial scholarship includes up to 992 Euros plus 300 Euros for cost of studies.

Katholischer Akademischer Ausländer-Dienst (KAAD) (Catholic Academic Exchange Service)

(Catholic Church support required, recommendation from your local bishop)

The KAAD is the scholarship organisation of the Catholic Church in Germany for postgraduates and academics from (developing) countries in Asia, Africa, Latin America, the Middle East and Eastern and South-Eastern Europe. By providing scholarships, educational events and personal and spiritual guidance, it supports its scholarship holders in view of their future multiplying activities in their home countries.

The scholarships are for lay persons of basic Christian belief who are actively engaged in church-related activities and willing to demonstrate an appropriate personal way of living. Applicants of another religion can be funded if they are proposed by Catholic partners in view of a documentable willingness to engage in interreligious dialogue.

The KAAD offers 3 Scholarship Programmes:

- 1) Scholarship Programme 1 supports students, who come from and currently reside in a developing or emerging country in Africa, Asia, the Middle East or Latin America and would like to pursue a Master's degree, a PhD or other postgraduate studies, or are planning a post-doc or a research stay (2-6 months for academics) at a German university.
- 2) Scholarship Programme 2 supports students from countries of the Global South who are already studying for their PhD or Master's degree in Germany.
- 3) The Eastern Europe Programme supports - in cooperation with the partner committees - PhD and Master's programmes, as well as shorter study and research stays in Germany.

Requirements for applicants

Nationality:	Foreign students (from Africa, Asia, the Middle East or Latin America) The Eastern European Program addresses people from Middle/East/Southeast, Europe, Caucasian countries, and Central Asia. Applications from other countries can only be considered in exceptional cases.
Deadline:	January 15 and June 30 (applications for Scholarship Program 2 and KAAD Eastern Europe Programme)
Language skills:	German A2-B1

Avicenna-Studienwerk (Scholarship-Avicenna-Studienwerk)

The Avicenna-Studienwerk is a non-profit, registered association (e.V.) and it supports high-achieving and committed Muslim students and doctoral candidates from all disciplines who are enrolled at state or state-recognized universities in Germany. The focus is on Muslims, although in justified exceptional cases – for example, if someone is particularly committed to dialogue with Islam or has a specific connection to Islam during their studies – people of other denominational affiliations can also be accepted as scholarship holders.

The central aim of the Avicenna-Studienwerk is to provide support to talented Muslim students and doctoral candidates through scholarships. Through its special educational as well as mentoring programmes, it provides suitable spaces for promising and motivated young Muslims to develop academically and personally. The Scholarship Programmes are funded by the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research.

Economy-related Institutions

SBW Berlin Scholarship

SBW believes that through education and social commitment you can improve living conditions of others as well as your own. The SBW Berlin scholarship program supports social commitment by funding social projects and comprises three different types of scholarships:

1)The SBW Berlin scholarship for studies in the social sector supports talented young people in Germany who have already made a social commitment and use the skills they have acquired during their studies in the context of social projects during and after their studies.

2)The SBW Berlin Scholarship for Refugees supports young talented refugees in Germany who want to get socially involved and use the skills they acquired during their studies in social projects during and after their studies.

3)The SBW Berlin Scholarship for International Students supports talented young people from abroad who have already shown social commitment and who use the skills they have acquired during their studies during and after their studies in social projects at a non-profit/social organization in their home countries.

The social commitment of applicants or incoming scholarship recipients and their strong motivation therefor, in general, are fundamentally required. Furthermore, SBW Berlin scholarship recipients are expected to proactively develop and implement social projects or to proactively engage in social activities during a sponsorship.

The duration of the funding is a minimum of 30 days to a maximum of 48 months. The respective standard period of study is decisive. Funding is granted in periods, usually for the following semester.

Requirements for applicants

Application deadline: no fixed application deadline

Age limit: 18-30 (students from ASH can apply if they fulfil all requirements yet are older than 30 years)

Stiftung der Deutschen Wirtschaft (Foundation of German Business (sdw))

The scholarship program was named after the former employer president, Prof. Dr. Klaus Murmann. As one of the initiators of the founding of the Foundation of German Business, it was important to him to support students and doctoral candidates in further developing their sense of community and entrepreneurial mindset. To this day, the scholarship program is supported by the non-independent Klaus Murmann Scholarship Foundation within the sdw.

The Studienförderwerk Klaus Murmann supports outstanding and socially committed students from all kinds of disciplines and types of universities who want to actively shape their own path, think and act entrepreneurially and want to participate responsibly in society.

From funds from the Federal Ministry of Education and Research, all scholarship recipients receive monthly financial support based on their income. In addition to financial support from the funds of the Federal Ministry of Education and Research, the Studienförderwerk offers its scholarship holders a diverse and extensive non-material program with which we want to impart knowledge, skills and attitude.

The Spener Foundation is a private organization that supports both German and international students, primarily those studying at universities in Berlin, who are facing financial hardship. The foundation has been awarding scholarships to students since 1960.

Students enrolled at a German university whose income does not exceed twice the Hartz IV rate and who require financial assistance to continue their studies are eligible to apply. Please note that applications must be submitted manually in writing to the foundation's address.

The scholarship is awarded for one semester and paid out in installments of €300 each over four months. An extension is only possible once.

Application deadlines: March 15 (for the summer semester), September 15 (for the winter semester)
