GUIDELINES FOR WRITING THE PROJECT REPORT

- I. Abstract (max. 200 words)
- II. Introduction
 - A brief introduction to the topic and context, including objectives of the project / research question
- III. Theoretical framework
- What theoretical framework does the project draw on and how is this connected to a human rights perspective? **IV. Methodology**

How was the project implemented? (Time, place, methods, ...)

V. Outcomes

What were the main project results?

VI. Conclusion

Did the project succeed in terms of its initial objectives and in terms of contributing to a human rights perspective?

Length of the report: approx. 10 pages (Times New Roman, 12 pt font size, 1.5 line spacing)
